Shimanto City sits in the middle of the Shimanto River basin to where it flows into the Pacific Ocean. It flows gently while meandering through the heart of the city. However, it is a river prone to flooding and is capable of bringing about great damage. We have fostered the wisdom of how to live in harmony with the Shimanto River.

The river is filled with ayu (sweetfish), eel, river shrimp, and goby. Even now, fishermen find their calling in river fishing.

The lives of people here are closely linked with the river, thus Shimanto City is called a town that lives with the river. Please try to experience this living landscape.
